"I couldn't find a book that showed kids emotions were normal," said Walsh. "So I wrote my own, to use in conjunction with the workshops I do."

Walsh has two children of her own, aged six and nine, who attend Kemptville Public School

She has a BA in psychology and also studied art communicate with people who base dementia

"I had to find a way to that was non-verbal," said Walsh. "That's how I got into art therapy.

Walsh read 'Have You Hugged Your Alien Today?' to the grade three and four split class at Oxford that day. She also brought materials for each student to craft their own alien, including clay, glittery Eas-ter eggs, tin foil, popsicle sticks, glue and zip ties.

The kids were having a grand old time shaping and creating their own alien friends

ous parts of the aliens fall off as the activity pro-

gressed. The kids enjoyed the book because the little girl had a big imagination and every time she imagined stuff it showed in the book what she was imagining.

The kids said if they were aliens they would visit all sorts of weird places, including the ice cream therapy, as a way to better store, the inside of a shoe and an alien's house.

Some of the unique names they came up with communicate with them included Super Bob, Chopper and Princess.

"I like to give kids the opportunity to be cre-ative," said Walsh. She also made 'coping cards' with the kids, which centered around a discussion about how to positively deal with various emotions they experience.
